Volume I: paper, 52, etc. lines to a page.

Volume II: vellum, double columns of 52 lines, in several hands.

Additions: Old binding, red skin over boards, old label ·121· Bosses. Two metal tags at bottom of first cover, remains of two metal staples at bottom of second cover, straps.

Additions: Covers lined with service-book (**xiv**) and grammatical verses (**xiii**, **xiv**).

Foliation: ff. a-e (loose material) + i + 1-131.

Change of hand (and perhaps of treatise) at f. 14r, |106r|
