Vellum, 10 $\frac{1}{2}$  × 6 $\frac{3}{8}$ , ff. 195 + 2, normally 20 lines to a page. Cent. xi, in a magnificent large round upright minuscule, characteristic of St Augustine's, Canterbury: with many erasures and later additions.

*Collation*: 1 flyleaf, 1<sup>4</sup> (+ 1 or 6 wants 1) 2<sup>8</sup>-6<sup>8</sup> (wants 4, 5) 7<sup>8</sup>-21<sup>8</sup> (+ 2 after the 7th) 22<sup>8</sup>-25<sup>8</sup> (wants 8), 1 flyleaf: in 19 a slip is added after 7.

The first flyleaf is from an xith cent. copy of Bede's *History*, 29 lines to a page, finely written in the Christ Church hand :

Beda famulus Christi et presbiter. Historiam gentis anglorum  
—necnon et orientalium anglorum.

The last flyleaf, 32 lines to a page, in a different hand contains :

Bede, H. E. I 2: ta fuit qui anno ab urbe condita quingentesimo nonagesimo tertio

—occidenti libiorum a meridiano.

ff. 174-181 and 182 *a* are in a large bold pointed hand.

ff. 182 *b*-196 in a tall narrow round hand.

On 12, 16, 46, 48 *b*, 51 *b*, 54, 71 *b*, 92 *b*, 98, 101 *b* are fine polychrome decorative initials in many of which purple is used.

The text of the volume was printed by Mr Martin Rule (Cambridge, 1896) with two pages in facsimile, and a most elaborate and ingenious Introduction, in which Mr Rule contends that this Missal is copied from one given by Gregory to Augustine. Mr Rule has presented to the College a manuscript volume written by himself entitled *A Study of MS. C.C.C.C. 270*, which is preserved in the manuscript class.
